Social media is filled with perfect lives—you don't see the dirty dishes in the sink, or the tears shed. You see the wins and the brags. The same is true of many social media accounts for business. As business owners we want to show our best selves. Anything less is weak and unappealing.

Or is it?

Lately, something interesting is happening. The most effective posts aren't the polished ones with perfect lighting or studio-level graphics. They're the real, raw, behind-the-scenes moments that tell the true story of what it's like to run a small business.

From TikToks to Instagram Reels, business owners are discovering that authenticity—sharing the ups, the downs, and everything in between—helps them connect with customers in a meaningful way.

- **It boosts engagement.** Real stories spark conversation. They get shared, commented on, and remembered.
- **It sets you apart.** Big brands can't replicate your personal journey. That's your advantage.
- **It creates emotional connection.** And connection drives action, whether that's a sale, a visit, or a referral.

What Kinds of Stories Should You Share?

You don't need to be a professional storyteller or social media guru to do this well. In fact, the more natural and honest you are, the better. Just sound like you. Your best friend should read the post and remark, "That sounds like you."

Be vulnerable in a business savvy way. Here are a few ideas to get you started:

- The moment you decided to start your business
- A major obstacle you overcame and what you learned
- A behind-the-scenes look at your day (the chaos and the wins)
- A thank-you to your customers or team
- A mistake you made—and how you bounced back
- A natural disaster or other problem that required you to rebuild, restructure, or approach something in a different way

One important note: vulnerability doesn't mean oversharing. Keep your stories focused on what will resonate with your audience. Aim to inspire, relate, or educate, rather than just vent.

Unfortunately, there has been some extremely incorrect information circulating in the community pertaining to the Custer Chamber of Commerce and the cancellation of the Tesla Rally, which was held in May for the past several years. After years of issues arising from, and during this event with little return to the chamber and the community of Custer, coupled with the event contact person stepping away after the 2024 rally, the chamber board of directors voted at the July 2024 board meeting to discontinue this event. That information was scheduled to be published at that time, but an oversight occurred, and it did not make it to the public. Our meeting minutes will in fact reflect that decision that was made last July. The 2025 Chamber Event calendar was published in the fall of 2024, and that event was in fact not included as a chamber happening for the upcoming year.

A rumor has arisen suggesting that the Chamber canceled this event due to political protests related to Elon Musk. This claim is false. The Custer Chamber of Commerce, including its board, directors, and staff, is committed to keeping political opinions out of our decisions regarding community events. Our primary focus is on supporting our members and the community as a whole, and we take

ROCK BLASTING AND TRAFFIC IMPACTS

March 25, 2025 – April 27, 2025

Beginning Tuesday, March 25, 2025, the contractor will be conducting planned detonations to remove rock material. During blasting, a portion of U.S. Highway 385 will be closed to through traffic for up to one hour. The following blasts are scheduled and anticipated to take place in the next month:

Scheduled Closures:

Tuesday, March 25, 2025 & Thursday, March 27, 2025]

Between 10 a.m. and 2 p.m.

Closure in place from Sheridan Lake Road to Horse Creek Road.


Anticipated Closures:

The contractor is anticipating additional temporary road closures for blasting in the area between Sheridan Lake Road and Horse Creek Road in March and April. Exact dates and times are unknown at this time.

Up to two temporary road closures are expected to take place between Calumet Road and Sheridan Lake Road in April. Exact dates and times are unknown at this time.

How to Stay Up to Date:

A free text-in service is being used to communicate temporary closures due to rock blasting, when the road opens, and if any additional delays are expected. To subscribe, simply text "US385" to 605-566-4041. Subscribers can unsubscribe at any time.





Current Construction:

- Phase 2 construction operations currently involve off-road grading, tree clearing, and logging operations. The contractor is using a pilot car and flaggers as needed from 7 a.m. to 6 p.m. (MT) on weekdays and some Saturdays.

Upcoming Construction:

- Phase 1 (Pactola Dam to the Pennington-Lawrence County Line) permanent surfacing takes place this summer and will be completed by the end of July 2025. Currently, there are approximately two miles of gravel and three miles of hard surface between Pactola Dam and the Pennington-Lawrence County Line. During this time period, roadway users can expect the use of flaggers and pilot cars with delays up to 15 minutes.
- Closure C (Sheridan Lake Road to Be Still Road) takes effect on Monday, April 28, 2025, and ends Friday, June 13, 2025. During this time period, the closed roadway will not be open to through traffic. Outside of the closure, but within the construction area, travelers can expect pilot cars and wait times, the use of large construction equipment, narrowed driving lanes, and loose gravel surfacing.
- Closure D (Be Still Road to Calumet Road) begins on Tuesday, Aug. 12, 2025, and ends on Friday, Oct. 17, 2025. Closure E (Pactola Dam to Taylor Ranch Road) begins on Monday, Oct. 20, 2025, and ends on Friday, March 6, 2026.




