## ***CUSTER CONNECTIONS***



Small business owners are usually not short on ideas. You have them in the shower, in the car, halfway through a client call, and even in the middle of the night. Ideas for a new service. A better way to onboard customers. A partnership you should pursue. A social post series that would actually sound like you.

No, the problem is not creativity. The problem is action.

Most good ideas don't die because they were bad. They die because they never get translated into a next step while they're still exciting.

That's why you need the 48-Hour Rule.

The rule is simple:

**If an idea doesn't have a next action plotted and scheduled within 48 hours, it's not a plan. It's entertainment.**

This is not a judgment on your executing abilities. It's your business. The urgent pulls harder than the important. And once an idea slips behind payroll, customer emails, and the Tuesday fire drill, it rarely climbs back out.

So, let's talk about how to make the 48-Hour Rule work in real life with time limits.

## Why 48 Hours Works (And "Someday" Doesn't)

A new idea creates a burst of clarity. You can see the path. You can picture the result. You feel a little lighter because you've imagined a better version of your business.

But clarity fades fast.

In 48 hours, two things happen:

1. **Reality returns. Your current workload reasserts itself or you start doubting your abilities, your team's abilities, your customer's interests, or any other number of things that begin to cause...**
2. **The idea starts to feel bigger than it is. You forget the simple version and only remember the "perfect" version. This becomes next to impossible to put into action.**

The 48-Hour Rule protects your idea from both. It forces you to do one thing before the moment passes: **choose the next action.**

Not the whole plan. Not the branding. Not the full rollout. Just the next action.

## The Difference Between an Idea and a Next Action

An idea is fun, creative, exciting, while a next action is specific, physical, and schedulable. It's something you can do without needing another meeting with yourself. Shy away from your action being "research." It's easy to get lost in it with little to show.



Here are examples:

- Idea: “We should improve customer follow-up.”
- Next action: “Draft a two-email follow-up template and save it in the CRM.”
- Idea: “We should partner with another business.”
- Next action: “Write one partnership pitch email and send it to two businesses by Friday.”
- Idea: “We should raise prices.”
- Next action: “List top 10 services, current prices, and margins in a spreadsheet by Thursday at 10 a.m.”

If you can’t schedule it, it’s not a next action.

## How to Implement the 48-Hour Rule Without Blowing up Your Week

If you’re excited about your new idea, get something scheduled, even during a busy week.

Try this:

### Step 1: Capture the idea in one sentence.

Not five paragraphs. One sentence. Put it in a running note on your phone or a single “Idea Parking Lot” document.

### Step 2: Write the smallest next action.

Ask: “What’s the first move that would make this 5% more real?”

### Step 3: Schedule it inside the next 48 hours.

Not “this week.” Not “soon.” Put a 15–30-minute block on your calendar. Treat it like a client meeting. Because it is. Your future revenue is sitting in the lobby.

### Step 4: Give it a finish line.

The goal of that block is not perfection. It’s progress you can point to. A draft. A message sent. A decision made. A file created.

## The “Two-Track” Trick for Busy Seasons

If you’re in a truly slammed stretch, use this adjustment: **you only have to schedule one of two things within 48 hours:**

- The next action *or*
- A decision to deliberately defer it (with a date)

That second option matters. Because “not now” can be a smart business decision.

If you can’t do the action, schedule a 10-minute decision block: “Do we pursue this in Q1 or not?” That keeps you moving.

## What This Looks Like Over Time

The magic of the 48-Hour Rule isn’t that every idea becomes a big initiative. Instead, your business becomes a place where ideas get handled, not hoarded.

You’ll start to notice:

- Fewer loose ends rattling around in your brain
- Faster follow-through (which customers feel immediately)
- More momentum inside your team
- Better instincts about what’s worth doing, because you’re testing ideas in small bites

Action compounds in the way that matters, reducing chaos and increasing innovation.

## A Simple Challenge for This Week

Pick one idea you’ve been sitting on. Just one.

Write the next action. Schedule 20 minutes for it in the next 48 hours. Then do it.

That's how businesses grow—small, consistent moments of follow-through.

## Ask the Chamber

If you're thinking, "I have ideas, but I need the right people, resources, or a push," you're not alone. That's exactly what a chamber of commerce is built for: turning good intentions into traction.

Use your chamber for the kind of next actions that matter:

- Ask them to make an introduction that leads to a partnership or something specific you need
- Attend one event and meet your next vendor or client
- Join one committee and get closer to decision-makers
- Ask one question and get practical insight from business owners who've been there

Your idea may be game changing, but you won't know until you execute. You may not have time to get it completely worked out and implemented, but you do have time to start with a 20-minute next step. Try the 48-Hour Rule this week. Then let your chamber help you turn that first step into a path.

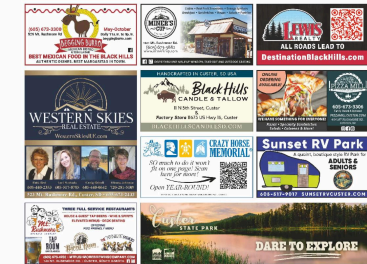

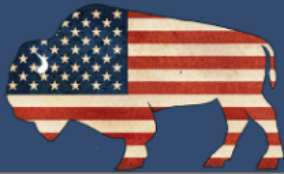

# **South Dakota Yesterday & Today**



Paul's talk previews his forthcoming book, *South Dakota Yesterday & Today*, scheduled for release this July. For nearly a decade, he has traveled the state locating the sites of more than 300 historic photos from the 1870s to the 1970s and recreating them with precisely matched modern images. This approach puts history in context, revealing environmental change and the growth—or decline—of towns, cities, and landscapes. Paul will explain how he acquired and selected historic images, determined where they were taken, and used techniques—including high-resolution digital photography and drones—to replicate views originally captured from airplanes, water towers, grain elevators, and other structures that may no longer exist.

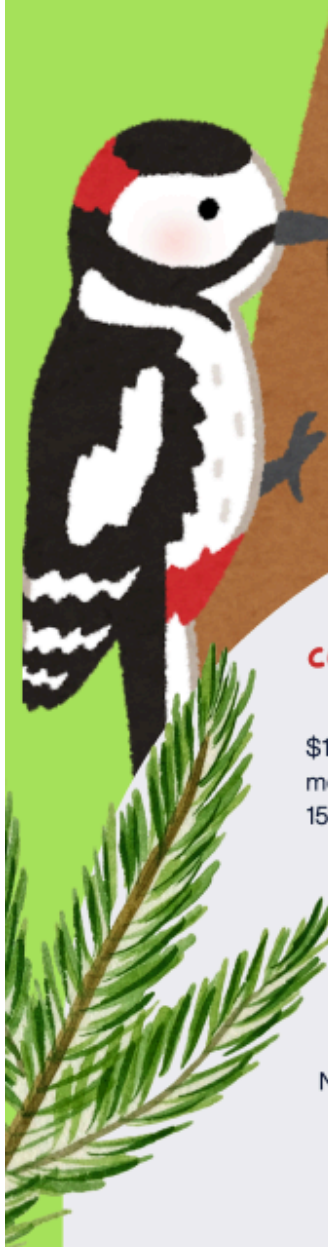

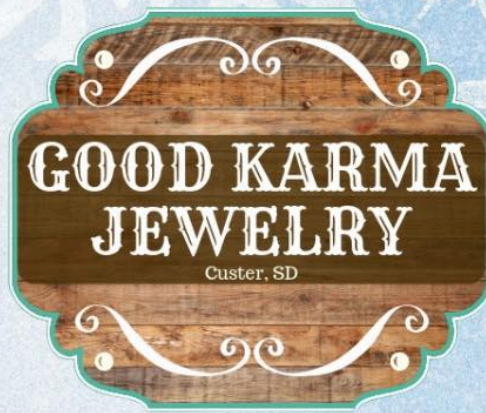

### **From Rising Stars to Lasting Legends, South Dakota Celebrates Tourism Excellence**

PIERRE, S.D. – Twelve awards were presented honoring businesses and individuals for outstanding achievements and contributions to the tourism industry. Winners received their awards from **Governor Larry Rhoden** and **James Hagen**, Secretary of the Department of Tourism (Travel South Dakota), on Thursday night at the **2026 South Dakota Governor's Conference on Tourism**.

The **Governor's Tourism Rising Star Award** was presented to **Phoebe Caldwell\*** of **Spearfish**. This award recognizes an individual who has worked in the tourism industry for two to four years, is excelling in their career, and whose work is demonstrating a bright future in the tourism industry. Starting as an intern at **Visit Spearfish**, Caldwell quickly rose through the ranks to become director of marketing.

"Not only does she oversee all digital marketing, email campaigns, social media, budget management, and creative direction, she's transformed the local event scene," Hagen said. "Her collaborative spirit and forward-thinking approach are sure to leave a lasting impact on Spearfish and the future of tourism in our state."

The **Peter Norbeck Excellence in Tourism Innovation Award** was given to **Beth Simonson\*** of **Highmore**. What started as a sunflower photo shoot in 2023 transformed into the **Sunflower Festival**. In 2024, the 2<sup>nd</sup> Annual Sunflower Festival attracted more than 500 visitors from 13 states, including some that traveled from Louisiana to South Dakota specifically for the festival.

The **Rooster Rush Cacklin' Community Award** was presented to **Pierre** and **Fort Pierre** for going above and beyond to make in-state and out-of-state hunters feel welcome in South Dakota. Together, these communities hosted a storefront decoration contest with 33 participating businesses.

The **Rally Rush Rumbly Community Award** was given to **Visit Brookings** for their outstanding efforts in welcoming visitors before the Sturgis Motorcycle Rally. Starting with a social campaign aimed at visitors heading west on Highway 14, Brookings went on to welcome travelers with swag, giveaways, admission deals, a partnership with local auto shops, and cross-promotion with neighboring communities.

"This community was a shining example of collaboration involving local businesses, hotel partners, and thinking outside the box to spread love around the state," said Hagen.

The **A.H. Pankow Award** recognizes a representative of the media for showing superior interest in and providing coverage of South Dakota's tourism industry. This year's award went to **Jeff Erickson\*** of **Riverfront Broadcasting** in **Yankton**. A long-trusted voice for southeast South Dakota, Erickson was recognized for his dedication to sharing community stories with accuracy, passion and pride.

There were two winners for this year's **George S. Mickelson Award**, which honors businesses, communities, or organizations that exceed visitors' customer service expectations all year long. Because of their professionalism, warmth,

and authentic enthusiasm, the **Black Hills Visitor Information Center in Rapid City** won for acting as both a welcoming first stop and a trusted guide for anyone about to explore.

“By combining thoughtful listening with local expertise, they ensure every visitor experience today shapes a better one tomorrow,” said Hagen.

**Experience Sioux Falls in Sioux Falls** also won a **George S. Mickelson Award** for their year-round dedication to elevating hospitality through a locally developed online training program that equips frontline workers with customer service skills that help them become proud ambassadors for the entire state. During National Travel and Tourism Week in 2025, they also personally delivered 180 dozen freshly baked cookies to hotels, attractions and media partners across the city.

“Governor George S. Mickelson often closed his speeches by saying, ‘The people who make a difference are the people who show up,’” said Hagen. “Without a doubt, this organization has shown up.”

The **Ruth Ziolkowski\* Outstanding Hospitality & Customer Service Award** is given annually to four industry members, each representing one of the four tourism regions in South Dakota. This award recognizes tourism industry professionals who provide remarkable service to visitors and whose work demonstrates an outstanding spirit of hospitality. These awards were given to **Laurie Sutterer\*** of **Visit Rapid City in Rapid City**; **Lauren Dietz\*** of the **Children’s Museum of South Dakota in Brookings**; **Todd Moser\*** of **Wilbert’s Service in Pollock**; and **Noreen Jorgensen\*** of **Blue Tin Ranch in Burbank**.

The **Ben Black Elk Award** is a prestigious honor recognizing an individual who makes outstanding contributions to the state’s visitor industry. This year’s award was given to **Rollie Noem\*** of **Hill City**. For more than 40 years, Noem’s tireless work with South Dakota Game, Fish & Parks, Crazy Horse Memorial, and the South Dakota Parks & Wildlife Foundation helped develop and promote South Dakota’s natural and cultural resources. Working as a trails coordinator, he developed the Black Hills Snowmobile Trail System, a massive undertaking that helped cement the northern Black Hills as a year-round destination. During his 19 years as director of Custer State Park, the park transformed from a drive-through destination into a nationally renowned gem. He also helped grow the Custer State Park Buffalo Roundup into the world-class event it is today.

“Perhaps no one since Peter Norbeck has left such a lasting footprint across the natural landscapes of South Dakota, and inspired future conservationists for generations to come,” said Hagen.

The South Dakota Department of Tourism is comprised of Travel South Dakota and the South Dakota Arts Council. The department is led by Secretary James D. Hagen

## USDA Forest Service issues revised oil and gas leasing rule

*New rule speeds leasing and permitting for federal oil and gas development*

(Washington, D.C., Jan. 27, 2026) — The U.S. Department of Agriculture’s Forest Service finalized revisions to its regulation governing federal oil and gas resources on National Forest System lands. The revision modernizes and streamlines the process for managing energy development across millions of acres.

U.S. Secretary of Agriculture Brooke L. Rollins and Interior Secretary Doug Burgum announced the updated rule today, emphasizing the Trump Administration's joint commitment to eliminating outdated and burdensome processes and advancing President Donald J. Trump's Executive Orders on Declaring a National Energy Emergency and Unleashing American Energy.

"President Trump has made it clear that unleashing American energy requires a government that works at the speed of the American people, not one slowed by bureaucratic red tape," said Secretary Brooke Rollins. "This rule gives energy producers the certainty they need to expand supply to make energy more affordable, create jobs, and ensure America remains the dominant force in global energy markets - all while safeguarding forests and communities. Energy security is national security. These revisions create clarity and alignment across federal agencies, allowing our teams to move swiftly on leasing and permitting so American families and businesses can rely on affordable, dependable energy, while continuing to be good stewards of our public lands."

"We are replacing the Biden administration's bureaucratic delays with American innovation and efficiency," said Secretary Doug Burgum. "These new rules provide the certainty needed to boost production, slash energy costs, and guarantee our global leadership. By streamlining permitting and cutting bureaucracy, we are lowering costs for families, creating jobs, and securing our nation all while protecting our public lands."

The final rule (36 CFR 228 Subpart E), now published in the Federal Register, updates and simplifies federal oil and gas leasing procedures, allowing the Forest Service and Bureau of Land Management (BLM) to seamlessly coordinate when issuing permits. By establishing a single, clearly defined leasing decision point and reducing duplicative analysis, the rule improves response times to industry requests, helps reduce longstanding backlogs, accelerates lease issuance, and supports the timely processing of applications for permits to drill.

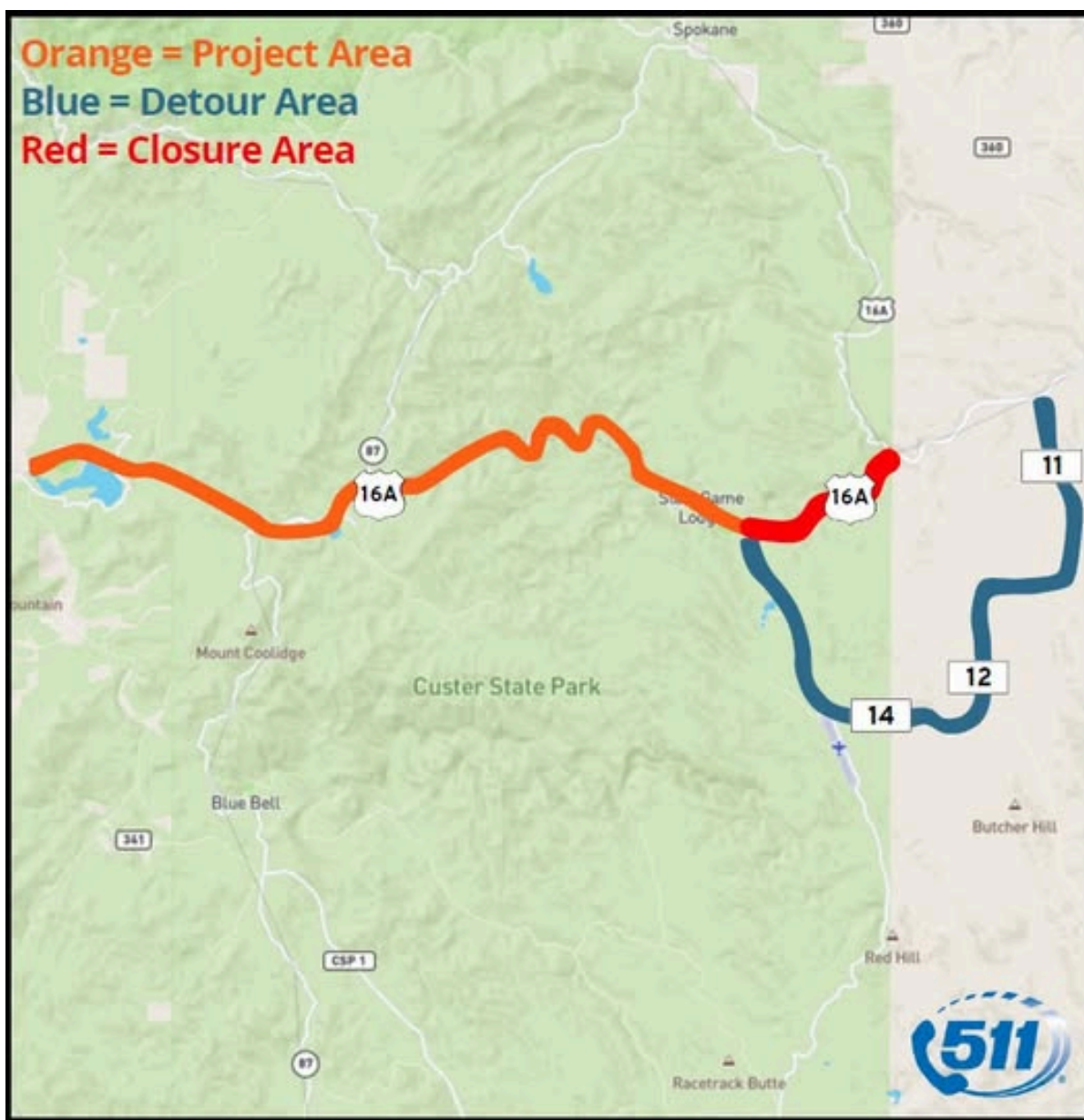
Under federal law, the Forest Service manages the surface estate of National Forest System lands, while the BLM manages the subsurface mineral estate. The two agencies work together to develop permitting conditions under their respective authorities.

Currently, 5,154 federal oil and gas leases cover approximately 3.8 million acres (about 2%) of National Forest System lands. Of these, roughly 2,850 leases spanning 1.8 million acres across 39 national forests and grasslands contain producing federal oil or gas wells.

**About the Forest Service:** The USDA Forest Service has for more than 100 years brought people and communities together to answer the call of conservation. Grounded in world-class science and technology— and rooted in communities—the Forest Service connects people to nature and to each other. The Forest Service cares for shared natural resources in ways that promote lasting economic, ecological, and social vitality. The agency manages 193 million acres of public land, provides assistance to state and private landowners, maintains the largest wildland fire and forestry research organizations in the world. The Forest Service also has either a direct or indirect role in stewardship of about 900 million forested acres within the U.S., of which over 130 million acres are urban forests where most Americans live.

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At 11 a.m. MT today, Monday, Oct. 6, 2025, a road construction project is scheduled to begin on U.S. Highway 16A near Custer. The reconstruction project to replace a box culvert structure and multiple pipe culverts is located 14 miles east of Custer or nine miles west of the S.D. Highway 79 intersection. Highway 16A will be closed from the intersections of Highway 16A/Iron Mountain Road to Custer State Park's Wildlife Loop. **This closure will be in place until April 2026.** Additional work will include replacing multiple pipe culverts, building gabion walls, and mill and overlay asphalt from Custer State Park's east entrance to the west entrance for 13 miles. Custer State Park's Wildlife Loop and Iron Mountain Road will remain open throughout the project.

During the Highway 16A closure, there will be a detour in place. The detour route is from the intersection of S.D. Highway 36 and Custer County's Ritterberger Road, south two miles to Cobb Road intersection, west one mile on Cobb Road, south one and one-half miles on Cobb Road to the intersection of LH Road, west approximately two miles on LH Road to Custer State Park's Wildlife Loop Road, and then north two miles on the Wildlife Loop Road back to Highway 16A. Motorists should be aware that the detour on Ritterberger Road, Cobb Road, and LH Road includes six miles of gravel. The Wildlife Loop Road is two miles of asphalt with a reduced speed limit of 25 mph.

S.D. Highway 40 between Hermosa and Keystone also provides a detour option for area motorists. Find additional project information at <https://dot.sd.gov/16a-culverts>. This website includes project updates, photos, and a downloadable map that demonstrates the project area and detour route.

The overall project completion date is October 2026.

# South Dakota DOT Update



## Project Update

Friday, Jan. 23, 2026

### Current Construction:

- Closure E (Pactola Dam to Taylor Ranch Road) is currently in place and ends on Friday, March 6, 2026. Outside of the closure area, construction crews are continuing work on the roadway.
- The driving surface within the construction area is a combination of pavement, blotter (a hard, packed surface that resembles asphalt), and gravel. Portions of U.S. Highway 385 are gravel, including the segment from Wrinkle Valley Road to ½ mile from South Sanders Ranch Road, and the segment from Sheridan Lake Road to ½ mile to the north.
- The contractor is placing topsoil along the roadway from Sheridan Lake Road to Custer Gulch Road. Pilot cars, with wait times of up to 15 minutes, are being used within the construction area as needed during working hours.



- In the event of winter weather, the South Dakota Department of Transportation will plow and maintain the construction area, as well as Custer Gulch Road.

Within the closure area, the contractor continues to conduct planned rock blasting the excavation and replacement of culverts, and grading of the roadway. Existing pavement is being milled and reclaimed to be used as fill material as the road is reconstructed.

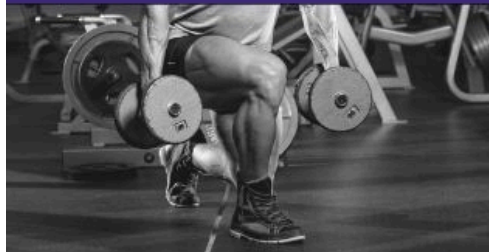

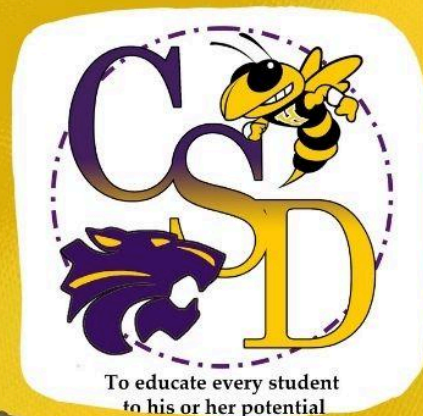

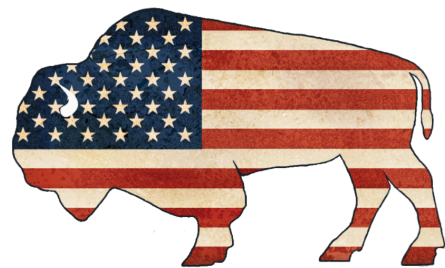
