# FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE BHPFA Supports Women's Stewardship Project on Black Elk Peak Trail

**Custer, S.D.** — **Oct 29** — At the beginning of October, Black Hills Parks & Forests Association partnered with Wilderness Volunteers and SheJumps to host a women's stewardship project in the Black Hills.

The weeklong project brought together 10 women from across the country for hands-on leadership training to prepare them to co-lead future Wilderness Volunteers projects nationwide. The effort was funded through a grant partnership with the National Forest Foundation and Athletic Brewing Company. The organizations provided full scholarships for all participants to attend the training.

Despite adjustments due to the recent federal government shutdown, the group's impact was substantial. Volunteers cleared overgrown vegetation and trimmed brush along two miles of trail and built more than 80 drainage features to improve erosion control and water management on the Custer State Park portion of the popular Black Elk Peak Trail 9 South.


"We are grateful for the support of the trail crew and leadership at Custer State Park, who helped us pivot due to the government shutdown," said Andrea Fountain, Program Manager for BHPFA. "We helped Custer State Park with much needed work that has a positive effect on our Forest Service partner, too, since Trail 9 starts in Custer State Park and continues into Black Hills National Forest. #### National Park Service Plans Prescribed Fire

#### at Mount Rushmore National Memorial - Starling Basin

KEYSTONE, S.D. – The National Park Service at Mount Rushmore National Memorial plans to conduct a prescribed fire at Starling Basin, a 95-acre burn, on or after Oct. 1, 2025, weather permitting.

For visitor and firefighter safety, some areas of the park may be temporarily closed during the operation. Visitors may see smoke in the area, and short-term smoke impacts are possible along Highway 244 and in nearby communities.

Firefighters will monitor conditions to minimize smoke impacts and ensure the fire remains within designated boundaries. The project is expected to take approximately seven days to complete.

The Starling Basin prescribed fire is part of an ongoing effort to reduce hazardous fuels, improve forest health, and enhance wildlife habitat within the Memorial. Safety is the priority, and the prescribed fire is scheduled to be conducted only under favorable weather and environmental conditions.

"Prescribed fires help reduce the risk of larger, more severe wildfires, promote healthy forests and support diverse wildlife habitats," said Jonathan Dunbar, Fire Management Officer for the Northern Great Plains Fire Management Zone. "By reducing fuel loads and improving ecosystem conditions, we're investing in the long-term health of the Memorial's landscape."

The Starling Basin prescribed fire is a collaborative effort involving the National Park Service's Northern Great Plains Fire Management Zone, Mount Rushmore National Memorial staff, and multiple interagency partners, including federal, state and local fire departments.

At 11 a.m. MT today, Monday, Oct. 6, 2025, a road construction project is scheduled to begin on U.S. Highway 16A near Custer. The reconstruction project to replace a box culvert structure and multiple pipe culverts is located 14 miles east of Custer or nine miles west of the S.D. Highway 79

#### intersection.

Highway 16A will be closed from the intersections of Highway 16A/Iron Mountain Road to Custer State Park's Wildlife Loop. This closure will be in place until April 2026. Additional work will include replacing multiple pipe culverts, building gabion walls, and mill and overlay asphalt from Custer State Park's east entrance to the west entrance for 13 miles. Custer State Park's Wildlife Loop and Iron Mountain Road will remain open throughout the project.

During the Highway 16A closure, there will be a detour in place. The detour route is from the intersection of S.D. Highway 36 and Custer County's Ritterberger Road, south two miles to Cobb Road intersection, west one mile on Cobb Road, south one and one-half miles on Cobb Road to the intersection of LH Road, west approximately two miles on LH Road to Custer State Park's Wildlife Loop Road, and then north two miles on the Wildlife Loop Road back to Highway 16A. Motorists should be aware that the detour on Ritterberger Road, Cobb Road, and LH Road includes six miles of gravel. The Wildlife Loop Road is two miles of asphalt with a reduced speed limit of 25 mph. S.D. Highway 40 between Hermosa and Keystone also provides a detour option for area motorists. # **Project Update**

Friday, Oct. 17, 2025 Current Construction:

- Closure E (Pactola Dam to Taylor Ranch Road) begins on Monday, Oct. 20, 2025, and ends on Friday, March 6, 2026.
- The intersection of Custer Gulch Road and U.S. Highway 385 has been temporarily moved 300 feet to the north. A temporary diversion is in place while the contactor places a pre-cast box culvert.
- In addition to daily use, the contractor is utilizing night crews with pilot cars approximately one mile north of Sheridan Lake Road as underground pipe installation takes place.
- Roadway grading is taking place between Sheridan Lake Road and McCurdy Gulch Road.
- Rock blasting in the project area continues through the fall. During blasts, traffic will be managed with a pilot car, and there may be wait times of up to 15 minutes.

# **Upcoming Construction:**

• Over the winter, the roadway within the construction area will be a combination of pavement, blotter (hard, packed roadway surface that resembles asphalt), and gravel driving surfaces. Gravel will be in place from Wrinkle Valley Road to 1/2-mile from South Sanders Ranch Road.






