Elk bugling programs and cave tours offered this fall at Wind Cave National Park

HOT SPRINGS, SD – Rangers at Wind Cave National Park will be leading programs throughout September and early October to listen for the bugle of the Rocky Mountain elk. The elk's high-pitched whistle heralds the arrival of fall and the elk's mating season.

Beginning Monday, September 8, rangers are giving brief interpretive programs about elk before leading a caravan to a nearby pullout to listen for them. These one-hour programs are offered Monday, Wednesday and Saturday evenings through Saturday, October 8. Participants meet at the Wind Cave Visitor Center front lawn at 7 p.m. and are encouraged to bring a flashlight, a camp chair or blanket to sit on, and to dress warmly. The program will be cancelled due to inclement weather.

To listen to an elk's bugling call, visit the park's website at https://www.nps.gov/thingstodo/elk-bugling-wica.htm.

Fall ranger programs also include Natural Entrance and Garden of Eden Tours of Wind Cave throughout the day. Participants are encouraged to bring a light coat or sweater and good walking shoes. The Natural Entrance Tour lasts approximately 75 minutes and involves 300 stairs. The Garden of Eden Tour lasts one hour and involves 150 stairs. Tours will be offered every thirty minutes throughout the day between 9 a.m. and 4 p.m. through September 20, with reduced tours offered into the fall and winter.

Reservations for cave tours can be made up until 2 days before the tour at https://www.recreation.gov/.

The park visitor center will be open from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. daily through September 20 with winter hours, 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., beginning September 21.

Jewel Cave Announces Operations for Winter Season

CUSTER, SD – Jewel Cave National Monument is changing its operations for the winter season. Starting Tuesday, September 2, 2025, the monument will be open from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Mondays to Saturdays.

The monument will continue to offer the popular Scenic and Discovery Tours all through the winter, weather permitting. Through September, on select days, the monument will also offer the Wild Caving Tour.

Advance reservations for the Scenic and Discovery tours are recommended and will be available to book on Recreation.gov, with limited first-come, first-serve cave tour tickets available daily. Reservations are required for the Wild Caving Tour. Those interested are recommended to check the park website and Recreation.gov for initial steps on obtaining a spot on the Wild Caving Tour.

The monument also partners with the Black Hills Parks and Forests Association, which operates the park store inside the visitor center. The store will be open on the same schedule as the visitor center and provides visitors with multiple products and services to complement their visit.

Project Update

Friday, August 22, 2025

construction Schedule Update: Originally scheduled to end in late October, Closure C is now ending in early September. This is due in part to this summer's favorable weather, the contractor finding efficiencies in his operations, and having prioritized certain construction activities outside of closure areas to reduce the amount of time needed for this closure.

Current Construction:

- Closure C (Sheridan Lake Road to Be Still Road) is in effect through Tuesday, Sept. 2, 2025. During this time, the road is closed to all through traffic. Access to Be Still Road will be maintained from the north end of the closure with a pilot car as needed. The posted detour is S.D. Highway 44 and U.S. Highway 16.
- Outside of the closure, but still within the Phase 2 construction area (south end of Pactola Dam to Calumet Road), travelers can expect pilot cars and wait times, the use of large construction equipment, and narrowed driving lanes.
- The contractor is utilizing night crews with pilot cars approximately one mile north of Sheridan Lake Road as underground pipe installation takes place.
- South Beach, South Campground, and the Sheridan Lake Fishing Pier parking lot remain open and can be accessed by approaching on Highway 385 from the south.
- Rock blasting is taking place in the closure areas, and travelers may notice more noise and dust in the area.

Upcoming Construction:

 Closure E (Pactola Dam to Taylor Ranch Road) begins on Monday, Oct. 20, 2025, and ends on Friday, March 6, 2026.

We appreciate the public's patience and cooperation as we complete this important maintenance work.



To apply for a job, there are 4 basic steps:

 - Enter your profile information and create a resume.

 - You do not need to create a USAJOBS

HELPFUL RESUME TIPS

- Make your resume includes your specialized experience as it relates to the duties section of the job announcements in USAJOBS.
- Include hours of work or full-time/parttime status for each job you include in the

account to search for jobs, but you do to create an account to apply for jobs.

- STEP 2: Search Jobs
 - Use the USAJOBS search feature to view jobs filtered by position and location or use the advanced search function search with more filters like pay or grade-level.
 - Review job opportunity announcements and save those of interest.
 - Carefully review the "Qualification and Evaluation" section to determine whether you could qualify for the position.
- STEP 3: Apply For Jobs
 - Carefully follow the instructions in the "How to Apply" section for each job announcement.
 - Submit any supporting documentation to verify your qualifications.
 - Leaving out a required document may result in you not being found eligible and/or qualified.
- STEP 4: Manage Your Career
 - Log into your USAJOBS account to obtain application status for positions for which you have applied.


