TRAVEL SOUTH DAKOTA RECEIVES NATIONAL TOURISM MARKETING AWARD

"Forever 605" Named Best State Tourism Stewardship Campaign in the Nation

PIERRE, S.D. – Travel South Dakota's "Forever 605" campaign was honored as the nation's best state tourism stewardship campaign, recognized by the U.S. Travel Association and industry peers at the annual ESTO (Educational Seminar for Tourism Organizations) conference in Columbus, Ohio.

Named after South Dakota's single area code, a local point of pride, Forever 605 is a destination stewardship program providing simple, yet impactful, ways to enjoy South Dakota respectfully.

"Forever 605 is an initiative we developed to spread the message of enjoying South Dakota responsibly for residents and visitors alike, and to ensure our state's pristine beauty is maintained for generations to come," said James Hagen, Secretary of Travel South Dakota. "Instead of creating a campaign centered around simply 'leaving a place better than you found it,' Forever 605 aims to build a sense of pride around respecting our destination and make it something that everyone wants to be a part of."

Components of the Forever 605 campaign include building awareness of lesser-known visitor experiences and locations, promoting South Dakota as a year-round destination, educating residents and visitors on the importance of responsible travel practices, supporting local businesses, preserving cultural heritage, and proactively sharing the positive contributions of tourism to South Dakota's way of life and economy.

More than 3,000 people have signed the Forever 605 pledge, and local communities have gotten on board with branding and encouraging action locally. The campaign was launched in earnest on June 5 (6/05/2024) and has

already generated more than 71,000 hotel bookings and 1,218 flight bookings. It has inspired visitors to visit lesserknown destinations, thereby relieving other destinations from overcrowding. It also has encouraged locals to explore hidden gems and encouraged community engagement.

The Mercury Awards recognize excellence and creative accomplishment in destination marketing from state tourism offices and are open to all U.S. state and territory tourism offices that are members of the U.S. Travel Association. The South Dakota Department of Tourism is comprised of Tourism and the South Dakota Arts Council. The department is led by Secretary James Hagen.

Proposed Changes to Recreation Fees Identified by the Black Hills National Forest

Custer, S.D., August 5, 2024 – The Black Hills National Forest is proposing changes to recreation fees for facilities, as well as Special Recreation Permit (SRP) fees under the Recreation Enhancement Act (REA) Fee Program. These changes include new and increased fees at several fee sites and for motorized OHV use permits. If approved, the proposed fees would be effective in 2025.

"Usage at recreation sites on the Black Hills National Forest has changed over the past 15-20 years," said Shawn Cochran, Forest Supervisor. "An increase of fees is needed to meet public expectations and the increasing demands of recreation activities across the forest."

In 2004, Congress passed the Federal Lands Recreation Enhancement Act (REA) which allows the Forest Service to retain funds collected at certain recreation sites and use these funds locally to operate, maintain, and improve the sites and related facilities. At least eighty percent of the revenue from recreation fees remains on the Forest to operate,

maintain, and improve facilities. Raising the revenue collected through recreation fees will help the Forest improve infrastructure at campsites and day-use areas and hire additional recreation staff. The resources derived through collection of fees helps provide quality recreation opportunities that meet the modern expectations of visitors and creates a more financially sustainable developed recreation program for the benefit of future generations.

These fee changes will be reviewed by the Black Hills National Forest Advisory Board (NFAB) and the Wyoming Recreation Action Team (REACT) for those sites in Wyoming. Committee members represent a broad array of interest groups to help ensure that the Forest Service is proposing reasonable and publicly acceptable new fees and fee changes. The public is invited to comment on the proposed fee changes to the developed recreation program. The comment

Pre-solicitation Notice for Concessionaire Prospectus on the Black Hills National Forest

Custer, SD, July 19, 2024 – A pre-solicitation notice has been issued to potential bidders for the concessionaire prospectus on the Black Hills National Forest, related to the operations and management of Forest campgrounds, day-use areas, picnic sites, and other developed recreation facilities. The prospectus will be advertised in 2025.

The prospectus will solicit proposals from interested parties for one campground concession special use permit to provide high-quality public service in the operation and maintenance of governmentowned recreation facilities. The new permit will replace the current concession permit, which expires December 31, 2025, with the intention that the successful applicant will be awarded the special use permit in January 2026.

The special use permit currently in place includes around 30 campgrounds, 14 picnic areas, 7 boat launches, 4 swim beaches, and multiple fishing areas. The exact number of sites for the upcoming prospectus has not yet been determined.

The Forest intends to host an official tour of the sites included in the prospectus in 2025. However, potential applicants are encouraged to visit sites on their own during the summer and early fall seasons of 2024.

This pre-solicitation notice is issued solely for information and planning purposes and does not constitute a solicitation, prospectus, or Request for Proposal. Further, the Black Hills National Forest is not seeking proposals at this time and will not accept unsolicited proposals. The U.S. Government will not pay for any information, travel, or administrative costs incurred in response to this pre-solicitation notice. Responding to this pre-solicitation notice or visiting the area is not required to apply for any future prospectus.

Fire Restrictions in Effect July 23, 2024 For Black Hills National Forest in Wyoming

Custer, S.D., July 22, 2024 — Black Hills National Forest Supervisor Shawn Cochran has signed a Stage 1 fire restrictions order for the Black Hills National Forest in Wyoming (WY). <u>Special Order 180</u> (& <u>Map</u>) will be effective Tuesday, July 23, 2024 through December 15, 2024, unless rescinded sooner.

"Persistent long-term drought conditions and recent high temperatures combined with the lack of moisture have dramatically increased the fire danger, said Jason Virtue, Black Hills National Forest Fire Staff Officer. "Conditions are ripe for large fire potential, and people need to be extremely careful in the Forest."

Stage 1 fire restrictions apply to campfires and smoking. Under Stage 1 restrictions, the following acts are prohibited: Building, maintaining, attending, or using a fire or campfire outside of a permanent metal or concrete fire pit or grate that the Forest Service has installed and maintained at its developed recreation sites in the WY Black Hills National Forest.

Other restrictions include: (see Exemptions)

- Smoking, except in an enclosed vehicle or building, a developed recreation site, or while stopped in an area at least three feet in diameter that is barren or cleared of all flammable materials.
- Operating a chainsaw without an effective and properly installed and approved spark arrestor.
- Blasting, welding, or operating acetylene or other torch with open flame without being in a cleared area of at least 10 feet in diameter and keeping a chemical pressurized fire extinguisher nearby.
- Using an explosive. This includes but is not limited to fuses, blasting caps, fireworks, rockets, exploding targets, tracers, and incendiary ammunition.

Construction Updates:

- Most construction activities are paused to accommodate additional traffic from local events until Monday, Aug. 12, 2024. All lanes are open to unimpeded traffic, and the roadway is, at a minimum, 24-feet-wide with a speed limit of 45 mph. Although the road is unfinished, uneven lanes and shoulder drop-offs are smoothed out.
- The roadway from Pactola Dam to S.D. Highway 44 is now sealed and has a hard surface that will be in place until final surfacing is placed in 2025.
- Traffic is being diverted on one gravel diversion (a temporary at-grade roadway next to the original road) immediately south of the Pennington-Lawrence County line. A width restriction of 12 feet is in place.
- The contractor is applying water to the gravel roadway to control dust as needed.





Coming Up:

- The box culvert near the Pennington-Lawrence County line is nearing completion, and Diversion 2 is expected to be removed in late August.
- Milling (removal of the existing pavement) on U.S. Highway 385 from 1/2-mile north of Silver City Road to the Pennington-Lawrence County line is expected to begin in mid-August.
