





Greetings, Tourism Partners!

As we head into the summer season, we'd like to share the latest insights and updates on travel trends we've been observing. Our recent reports have been positive, although the first few months of the year had a bit of a slow start. The good news is the forecasting model we have been working on (and plan to release soon) points to a positive visitation trend for late summer. The following data is from our most current *YTD Travel Indicators and Forecast* report (January - May 2024).

South Dakota CYTD visitation through May is down 1%, but we are encouraged by a significant 5.5% increase in visitor spending. This increase in spending has positively impacted tax revenue, which has risen by 9.5%. Despite YTD hotel occupancy and demand remaining relatively flat for the year, the most recent reports for April and May displayed solid performance for demand, increasing YOY by 7.2% in April and 4% in May.

Our state parks have experienced a remarkable 13% increase in camping nights, though we have noted a 10.2% decline in national park visitation. We know this decrease is largely due to construction near Mount Rushmore National Memorial and we hope to see that rebound soon. Air travel has shown a robust increase of 10%, and we are optimistic about July bookings, which are also looking good.

Ready for more good news? Americans are continuing to prioritize travel, despite a decrease in personal savings rates and consumer spending. Even with economic concerns, we are seeing optimism for the first quarter of 2024, as indicated by the consumer sentiment index released by the University of Michigan (slide 8). Positive indicators related to travel intent, such as increased web traffic, media engagement, and social media interactions, suggest that our marketing efforts are resonating with travelers and sparking interest in visiting South Dakota.

Mount Rushmore Celebrates Independence Day with Variety of Events and Activities

KEYSTONE, SD — Visitors to Mount Rushmore National Memorial on July 3rd and July 4th will have the opportunity to experience a variety of educational programs, patriotic tributes, and musical entertainment in celebration of Independence Day. All events are listed below. Specific times and locations are published on the park's *Event Calendar*.

Planned events include presidential re-enactors representing the four presidents on the sculpture: George Washington, Thomas Jefferson, Abraham Lincoln, and Theodore Roosevelt. The re-enactors will kick-off the park's celebration at 9:30 a.m. with an in-character news conference in the Carvers' Café. Visitors are encouraged to bring questions for the presidents to the event. At scheduled times, the presidents will give presentations, sign autographs, and mingle with visitors on the Memorial grounds.

Visitors will also have opportunities to enjoy Indigenous art, hoop dancing, music, and storytelling throughout the day from hoop dancers Starr Chief Eagle, Jasmine Bell, and storytellers and historians, Darrell Red Cloud and Sequoia Crosswhite.

July 3rd events will culminate with a special evening program beginning at 7:30 p.m. featuring a hoop dance performance by Jasmine Bell and musical performances by the Heartland of America band, Sophia Beatty, and Darrell Red Cloud. 

HOT SPRINGS, SD – After a twenty-one and a half-year career with the National Park Service, three and a half of those at Wind Cave National Park, Superintendent Leigh Welling is retiring June 29.

Welling began her career with the NPS in 2002 as director for the Crown of the Continent Research Learning Center at Glacier National Park in Montana. In 2007, Welling moved to Fort Collins, Colorado where she served as the national lead for climate change, eventually helping to establish and lead the NPS Climate Change Response Program in 2010. In 2015, Welling began working for the Alaska Regional Office, first as the regional chief scientist and then as the associate regional director for science, communication, and partnerships.

Welling earned an undergraduate degree in Geology from the University of Colorado Boulder and a Masters and PhD in Oceanography from Oregon State University. Prior to her career in the NPS, she held positions at the University of Nevada Las Vegas, where she worked on practices to increase diversity and inclusion in earth science curricula, and at the University of North Dakota, where she was director of the Regional Earth Science Applications Center.

Welling is retiring to Chadron, Nebraska, where she grew up. She looks forward to spending more time with family and friends along with riding her bike and exploring the outdoors.

Rhonda Schier, currently superintendent of Lincoln Boyhood National Memorial in Southern Indiana, will serve as Wind Cave's Acting Superintendent for the next four months.

Project Update

Friday, June 28th, 2024

Current Conditions:

- Closure A (the road to the North Boat Ramp to Pactola Dam) is in place through Friday, July 12, 2024.
- Milling (removal of the existing pavement) on U.S. Highway 385 from Highway 44 to the Pennington-Lawrence County line is underway. Phase 1 construction area (Pennington-Lawrence County line to the north end of Pactola Dam) will be a loose gravel surface until surfacing is completed in late 2025.
- Users of the roadway can expect delays of approximately 15 minutes and the use of flaggers from Highway 44 to the Pennington-Lawrence County line and the use of pilot cars and flaggers from Highway 44 to the road to the North Boat Ramp.
- Traffic is being diverted on two gravel diversions (a temporary at-grade roadway next to the original road).
 - Diversion 1 is approximately 3/4-mile north of the intersection of U.S. Highway 385 and Highway 44. A width restriction of 12 feet is in place.
 - Diversion 2 is immediately south of the Pennington-Lawrence County Line. A width restriction of 12 feet is in place.
- The contractor is now working Saturdays until Phase 1 construction is completed.

View Construction Updates

□ Road Closures Beginning May 20, 2024 □

- The Pactola North Boat Ramp will not be accessible during weekdays from Monday, May 20, 2024 through Friday, June 7, 2024 (accessible on weekends and Memorial Day from the north). After Friday, June 7, 2024, the Pactola North Boat Ramp will only be accessible from the north. Access will be available to the Pactola North Boat Ramp from all directions after Friday, July 12, 2024.
- Access to the Pactola South Boat Ramp will not be impacted during these closures. Boaters can access the South Boat Ramp via Highway 16/Highway 385 or Sheridan Lake Road/Highway 385.
- The posted detour will be S.D. Highway 44 and U.S. Highway 16. Locals may find alternative routes, but the SDDOT recommends travelers exercise caution when using non-maintained roadways.
- Emergency services are aware of these closures and are closely collaborating to provide response coverage.
- Non-closed areas within the project limits (Pennington-Lawrence County Line to Highway 44) will be under construction during closures.

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION:



- Follow posted speed limits in construction zones.
- Be aware of flaggers and other construction workers in the construction area.

- It is illegal to go beyond cones and barriers within construction zones even when the contractor is not working.
