If you're the typical small business owner, you began your business with an exciting idea, a passion. No one goes into business thinking, "I can't wait to work on cash flow challenges." And yet, cash flow is one of the top reasons businesses close their doors. It's not that they aren't making money. It's that managing it is not everyone's skill set.

Money management challenges are one of the most critical areas you need to master to be successful.

5 Money Management Tips for Better Business

Here are some of the key issues and ways to address them:

Many small businesses struggle with maintaining consistent cash flow. This can lead to difficulty paying bills, making payroll, or investing in growth opportunities.

You might have the money promised to you on paper, but not knowing when it will come in can be a challenge. Businesses at every level can be impacted by this so it takes consistent monitoring.

To improve cash flow:

- · Create detailed cash flow forecasts and monitor them regularly.
- · Encourage timely customer payments by offering incentives or implementing stricter payment terms. Enforce those terms and send out reminder invoices.
- · Negotiate favorable payment terms with suppliers.
- · Maintain a cash reserve for unexpected expenses or slow periods. According to a JPMorgan study of 597,000 small businesses, 25% held a reserve covering fewer than 13 days of expenses if other revenue dried up.

Small businesses often lack robust budgeting practices and struggle to track expenses effectively. If this feels like you, consider:

- · Creating a detailed, realistic budget and review it regularly.
- · Using accounting software (or an app) to automate expense tracking and generate accurate reports.
- · Separating personal and business finances to avoid confusion. Your accountant will appreciate it.
- . Accessing finances and adjusting hudgets regularly as needed

Tissessing infances and adjusting budgets regularly as needed.

Taking on too much debt or mismanaging existing debt can be detrimental to small businesses. COVID brought on unparalleled times. One thing we learned from it is that you must be prepared for the known challenges *and* the unknown ones.

To manage debt more effectively:

- · Be cautious about taking on unnecessary debt
- · Prioritize paying off high-interest debts first
- · Consider consolidating multiple loans to simplify repayments
- · Build and maintain a good business credit score

Many small businesses underestimate the importance of tax planning and compliance.

To improve in this area:

- · Work with a tax professional to stay on top of obligations and deadlines. If you don't know a reputable one, check with the chamber.
- Regularly set aside money for taxes.
- · Stay informed about tax laws and possible deductions.

Small businesses often lack the time or expertise for thorough financial analysis and planning. It's likely something that's best outsourced to a pro. Again, if you don't know one, check with the chamber.

To enhance financial management:

- · Understand and regularly review key financial statements including the balance sheet, income statement, and cash flow statement. It's boring, but beneficial.
- · Use financial management software to automate repetitive tasks and generate insights.
- · Establish financial protocols and plans, no matter how small your business is. Doing so early will put you on the path to success.
- · Regularly assess your business's financial performance and adjust strategies accordingly.

If you don't have the money to work with professionals right now, talk to your chamber, SCORE chapter, and SBA. There are many low-cost options to help you get on the right track for long-term success.



MINIMUM WAGE INCREASES JANUARY 1

Effective January 1, 2025, South Dakota's minimum wage for non-tipped employees will be **\$11.50 per hour**, up from \$11.20 per hour in calendar year 2024.

For tipped employees, the hourly minimum wage for calendar year

2025 will be no less than **\$5.75 per hour**, up from \$5.60 in calendar year 2024.

With limited exceptions, South Dakota's minimum wage applies regardless of the age of the employee, the number of hours worked each week, or length of employment.

Christmas Tree Permits Available on the Black Hills National Forest

Custer, S.D., Nov. 14, 2024 – Black Hills National Forest Christmas tree permits are available for purchase online at <u>Recreation.gov</u>, and available starting November 14, <u>from local Forest Service</u> offices and private vendors throughout the Black Hills.

To purchase a permit online, visit Recreation.gov and search for Black Hills National Forest Christmas Tree Permit. It is important to carefully read the overview and need-to-know information prior to purchasing the permit. Visitors will need to set up or login to a Recreation.gov account to complete the transaction. Each permit is \$10 for any tree, plus a \$2.50 processing fee. Users can purchase up to five permits per account. Online permits are ready to print immediately after purchasing and must be visible as you remove your tree(s) from the Forest.

Additionally, all 4th graders throughout the United States can receive a FREE Christmas tree permit, as part of the Every Kid Outdoors Program. The first step is to obtain a voucher or pass from Every Kid Outdoors website. If obtaining the Christmas tree tag online, go to Recreation.gov, enter the voucher or pass number when prompted. If obtaining your free tree tag from a local Forest Service office, take the voucher or pass along with to your local Forest Service office.

The Forest Service's Christmas tree cutting program helps improve forest health by thinning densely populated stands of small-diameter trees. Removing these trees from the designated areas helps other trees grow larger and can improve wildlife habitat by creating open areas that provide food. Furthermore, over 80 percent of the revenue generated from the sale of Christmas Tree Permits stays on the Forest and is used to enhance developed recreation sites, such as picnic areas, day-use sites, beaches, boat ramps and docks, and campgrounds.

Black Hills National Forest Offices are open Mondays through Fridays, except federal holidays. Please be advised that the Newcastle, Wyoming location will be closed on Friday, November 29 and Friday, December 6.

Many Forest roads are subject to seasonal closures. Free Motor Vehicle Use maps are available online at https://www.fs.usda.gov/detail/blackhills/maps-pubs/?cid=FSEPRD533421 or by downloading the Avenza App.

Jewel Cave to Have Impacts to Visitor Center Hours and Services Due to HVAC Replacement

Visitor Center Will Be Closed November 19-21

CUSTER, SD – Jewel Cave National Monument visitor center will be having its HVAC system replaced this winter. This work will reduce the availability of visitor center amenities and occasionally require the building to be closed throughout the winter. The replacement of the HVAC system is necessary to maintain a safe and cared-for visitor center facility.

While the HVAC system is being replaced, access to the visitor center exhibits may be closed off. The monument anticipates the final day to access the visitor center exhibits will be Monday, November 11. November 19-21, 2024, the visitor will be completely closed for necessary HVAC work and no cave tours will be offered. After this closure the visitor center plans to reopen at 9:30 a.m. on Friday, November 22. Currently, the only known dates of complete visitor center closure are November 19-21. When the visitor center is closed, the park including Roof and Canyons Trails will remain open for visitor use. Any additional dates the visitor center is closed will be announced on social media and the park website's *Alerts & Conditions* page. When open the monument will continue to offer the popular Scenic and Discovery Tours. Tours will be available to book in advance on *Recreation.gov*. KEYSTONE, SD — To celebrate *Native American Heritage Month*, Mount Rushmore National Memorial is excited to open a new outdoor exhibit focused on Lakota ethnobotany, star knowledge, and sacred sites. The exhibit, titled *Stone Hoop and Ethnobotanical Garden*, is organized in a circular design replicating Indigenous stone hoops found throughout North America. Several stone spokes originating from a center cairn correspond to significant sacred sites and celestial objects. 


