

Google recognized Black Hills Balloons as the only SD business featured in their 2020 annual Economic Impact Report, while Facebook recognized Keely as a "Facebook Leader," inviting her to a smal group (at time of inclusion, it featured 500 business owners nationwide). Both inviting her to separate Washington DC conferences in 2022 to learn and grow through personalized presentations and meeting fellow small business leaders. Since then, the business has been featured annually on national and local media, recognized by online platforms, and grown into a globally recognized business; one of the largest and longest-running hot air balloon flow businesses in the country. The business is now located in downtown Custer on Mt Rushmore Rd. MINIMUM WAGE INCREASES JANUARY 1

Effective January 1, 2025, South Dakota's minimum wage for non-tipped employees will be **\$11.50 per hour**, up from \$11.20 per hour in calendar year 2024.

For tipped employees, the hourly minimum wage for calendar year 2025 will be no less than **\$5.75 per hour**, up from \$5.60 in calendar year 2024.

With limited exceptions, South Dakota's minimum wage applies regardless of the age of the employee, the number of hours worked each week, or length of employment.





This week's membership spotlight goes to the *Custer Ambulance Service, Inc.* Here are some words from the staff. "Custer Ambulance Inc. Is a 501C3 that provides ambulance coverage to most Custer County residents and has done so for nearly 50 years. The ambulance is an independent entity, not affiliated with any other department of the City or County. The ambulance works closely with other public safety agencies to ensure that the community receives the best care possible.

In 2024 the ambulance changed from a combination or partially paid volunteer service to an all-paid service. The ambulance is made up of EMT, Advanced EMT, and Paramedics. We currently have over 20 employees.

The service has three ambulances, you may recognize the Bison, Elk, and Eagle on our units. We have state-of-the-art cardiac monitors and ventilators as well as many medications to treat our patients. Keep in mind, that the ambulance has much of the same equipment and medication that the emergency department does. If you are ill or injured CALL US! We will bring the care to you."

Christmas Tree Permits Available on the Black Hills National Forest

Custer, S.D., Nov. 14, 2024 – Black Hills National Forest Christmas tree permits are available for purchase online at <u>Recreation.gov</u>, and available starting November 14, <u>from local Forest Service offices</u> and private vendors throughout the Black Hills.

To purchase a permit online, visit Recreation.gov and search for Black Hills National Forest Christmas Tree Permit. It is important to carefully read the overview and need-to-know information prior to purchasing the permit. Visitors will need to set up or login to a Recreation.gov account to complete the transaction. Each permit is \$10 for any tree, plus a \$2.50 processing fee. Users can purchase up to five permits per account. Online permits are ready to print immediately after purchasing and must be visible as you remove your tree(s) from the Forest.

Additionally, all 4th graders throughout the United States can receive a FREE Christmas tree permit, as part of the Every Kid Outdoors Program. The first step is to obtain a voucher or pass from Every Kid Outdoors website. If obtaining the Christmas tree tag online, go to Recreation.gov, enter the voucher or pass number when prompted. If obtaining your free tree tag from a local Forest Service office, take the voucher or pass along with to your local Forest Service office.

The Forest Service's Christmas tree cutting program helps improve forest health by thinning densely populated stands of small-diameter trees. Removing these trees from the designated areas helps other trees grow larger and can improve wildlife habitat by creating open areas that provide food. Furthermore, over 80 percent of the revenue generated from the sale of Christmas Tree Permits stays on the Forest and is used to enhance developed recreation sites, such as picnic areas, day-use sites, beaches, boat ramps and docks, and campgrounds.

Black Hills National Forest Offices are open Mondays through Fridays, except federal holidays. Please be advised that the Newcastle, Wyoming location will be closed on Friday, November 29 and Friday, December 6.

Many Forest roads are subject to seasonal closures. Free Motor Vehicle Use maps are available online at https://www.fs.usda.gov/detail/blackhills/maps-pubs/?cid=FSEPRD533421 or by downloading the Avenza App.

KEYSTONE, SD — To celebrate *Native American Heritage Month*, Mount Rushmore National Memorial is excited to open a new outdoor exhibit focused on Lakota ethnobotany, star knowledge, and sacred sites. The exhibit, titled *Stone Hoop and Ethnobotanical Garden*, is organized in a circular design replicating Indigenous stone hoops found throughout North America. Several stone spokes originating from a center cairn correspond to significant sacred sites and celestial objects. This exhibit is a collaboration between financial support from the *National Park Foundation* (NPF), logistical support from the *Mount Rushmore Society*, and consultation with the Memorial's *Associated Tribal Nations*. "The National Park Service (NPS) thrives on strong partnerships," said Superintendent Michelle Wheatley, "this garden will enhance the visitor experience for years to come. - The contractor is continuing to place layers of gravel material from two miles north of S.D. Highway 44 to the Lawrence-Pennington County line.
- Users of the roadway can expect delays of approximately 15 minutes and the use of flaggers from two miles north of Highway 44 to the Pennington-Lawrence County line.
- The speed limit has been reduced through the construction area.
- The contractor is applying water to the gravel roadway to control dust as needed.
- The contractor is working Saturdays as necessary.

Coming Up:

- South Dakota Department of Transportation (SDDOT) and the contractor are prepared to provide snow removal operations within the construction area should winter weather arrive while construction is ongoing.
- Phase 2 (south end of Pactola Dam to Calumet Road) pre-construction activities are expected to begin in late 2024. Pre-construction activities include tree clearing near the roadway and off-road grading.
- A pre-construction informational meeting is scheduled for Thursday, Nov. 21, 2024, from 5 to 7 p.m. The meeting will take place at Rimrock Church (12200 S.D. Highway 44 Rapid City, SD 57702) and will focus on Phase 2 construction activities taking place in 2025 and 2026.




