Become a Junior Forest Ranger ~ Summer Programs at Pactola Visitor

Center

Custer, S.D., May 24, 2023— For the first time in many years, the Black Hills National Forest is offering <u>Junior Forest Ranger Programs</u> at the Pactola Visitor Center.

The Junior Forest Ranger (JFR) program is an exciting way for young people to explore and learn about the Forest. The JFR program uses Forest Service science and practices to encourage children 7 through 13 to enjoy and appreciate nature. JFR motivates children to explore the natural and cultural world and embrace their responsibility to it.

"These family friendly programs are perfect for adventurous forest explorers," said Michele Schleuning, Pactola Visitor Center Information Assistant. "Pack a lunch and plan to spend an educational early Saturday afternoon overlooking the beautiful Pactola Reservoir."

Each program <u>(see Flyer)</u> is from 1:00 - 2:00 p.m. and conducted by visitor center staff and volunteers.

June 10 - (National Get Outdoors Day) Sensing the Forest: There are many ways to learn about the forest using all our senses. Join Forest staff for a fun experience as we "sense" the outdoors and make nature journals to keep track of your forest experiences throughout the summer. Did you know ... National Get Outdoors Day, held each year on the second Saturday in June, is a nationwide event coordinated by the Outdoor Recreation Roundtable and the US Forest Service.

July 15 - Animal Outhouses: Scientists often learn about wildlife by looking at their droppings? Dissecting owl pellets is a fun and interesting way to learn about food chains, habitats, and how scientists collect and use data. Bring your little Forest Rangers to the visitor center for a fun story and then explore an owl pellet like a wildlife biologist.

August 5 - Fire in Nature: Learning to be fire-aware to prevent wildfires is an important part of keeping the forest safe. Did you know that the Forest Service also uses fire as a way to keep the forest healthy? Spend a Saturday afternoon at the visitor center and learn how fires are used

for various management activities ... and also learn how to help prevent forest fires. Participants will also receive Smokey Bear swag.

August 19 - (National Track Trails Day) Animal Hide and Seek: Animals have many ways to disguise themselves. This makes them very good at being able to play hide and seek. Join Forest staff to learn how and why animals use camouflage, then take part in making your own camouflage vest.

The Forest continues to work with a group of volunteers and partners in 2023 to create a Junior Forest Ranger

Program specific for the Black Hills National Forest. Using funding assistance from our cooperative partner, <u>Black</u> <u>Hills Parks & Forests Association</u>, and the design talents of our educational volunteers, the project is geared toward the development of a multi-page activity booklet and specially designed badge. The summer programs are helping the Forest learn more about participant (and parent) expectations.

NOTE: The <u>Pactola Visitor Center</u> is located along Hwy 385, about 14 miles north of Hill City, SD near the Pactola Reservoir. The facility opens for the season on Friday, May 26 and is open daily from 9:30 a.m. to 5 p.m.

Forest Service Road near Keystone to be Closed Temporarily

Rapid City, S.D., May 22, 2023— Black Hills National Forest officials will temporarily close National Forest System Road (NFSR) 353.2c, otherwise known as "Government Park," approximately 2 miles east of Keystone, SD on highway 40, for 30 days.

The road will be closed from June 1, 2023, and will remain closed until July 1, 2023.

- The closure order prohibits motor vehicle use on the road except for:
 - 1. Persons with a special use authorization from the Forest Service specifically exempting them from the order,
 - 2. Any federal, state, or local law enforcement officer or any member of an organized rescue or fire fighting force in the performance of an official duty.

The area is part of an active grazing allotment during the month of June. The purpose of the closure order is to protect the vegetation and forage used by livestock for grazing along NFSR 353.2c from the effects of motor vehicles parked or driven on the road shoulder.

Activities range from daily ranger talks, sculptor studio presentations, cultural demonstrations, and the evening lighting ceremony. Rangers also walk the grounds to engage in informal conversations about the significance of the site and to assist with orientation. Park programming has been scheduled to give visitors to the Memorial the flexibility to plan their visit efficiently. Programs are occurring throughout the site at a variety of locations throughout the day. Each day is completed by the renowned lighting of the sculpture accompanied by a ranger talk and a short film. Visitors are encouraged to plan their visit to the Memorial by visiting the park website or inquiring at the Information Center upon arrival to the site. All programs are subject to change due to inclement weather and staff availability.

Interpretive programming is one of the fundamental services provided by National Park Service sites nationwide. Ranger programs provide an opportunity for visitors to connect emotionally and intellectually to their shared national heritage. Visitors are encouraged to explore their personal connections to these sites through their engagement with park staff and other services provided at the Memorial.



Public input sought on draft air tour management plan for Mount Rushmore National Memorial

KEYSTONE, SD — The National Park Service (NPS) and the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) are seeking public

feedback on a draft Air Tour Management Plan (ATMP) and associated environmental assessment that are being proposed for Mount Rushmore National Memorial.

The agencies encourage anyone with an interest in or concern about air tours over Mount Rushmore National Memorial to review and comment on the draft ATMP and environmental assessment. The proposed plan would not authorize any air tours above or within 0.5 mile of the boundary of Mount Rushmore National Memorial. There were on average 3,914 air tours per year over Mount Rushmore National Memorial reported from 2017 – 2019.

Public feedback can be submitted through the NPS Planning, Environment and Public Comment (PEPC)

website starting May 16, 2023 through June 16, 2023. The NPS and FAA will consider comments to help inform the final ATMP for Mount Rushmore National Memorial. The project website is available at: <u>https://parkplanning.nps.gov/MountRushmoreATMP</u>.

"We encourage anyone who is interested in air tours over Mount Rushmore National Memorial to share their thoughts on the proposed plan," said Michelle Wheatley, the park's Superintendent. "The draft plan is based on extensive analysis and consultation with Tribes and other parties, as well as response to public comments from our September 2022 Scoping Newsletter. The purpose of the ATMP is to ensure that park resource values, including natural sounds, visitor experiences, wildlife, and other natural and cultural resources, are protected."

The NPS is developing an air tour management plan for Mount Rushmore National Memorial in cooperation with the FAA. The agencies are working towards completing the air tour management plan for Mount Rushmore National Memorial by December 31, 2023. The schedule is part of a plan approved by the U.S. Court of Appeals for the District of Columbia Circuit for the agencies to comply with the National Parks Air Tour Management Act of 2000.

An important part of the process is the inclusion of American Indian Tribes. The agencies are consulting with Associated Tribal Nations that hold historic and cultural significance to land and resources within the park.




