PARKING IN THE WINTER MONTHS

Rapid City, S.D., Nov. 17, 2023 — Forest Recreation Management (FRM) will be hosting their annual Half Price Pass Sale for the 2024 season on Friday December 1, 2023.

Please pay with cash or check; credit cards not accepted.

Requests made by mail will be honored if postmarked between Dec 1-3. Send to FRM, PO Box 1168, Hill City, SD 57745. Please include a self-addressed return envelope with a check for the appropriate amount.

The number of passes available for purchase per individual is unlimited, making them great gifts for stocking stuffers, gift exchanges and prizes for drawings. No other discounts are accepted with this offer. Those with senior or access passes as part of the America the Beautiful – National Parks and Federal Recreational Lands Pass Series can receive this reduced price any time.

"While purchasing a recreation pass at a Forest Service location, consider picking up a Christmas Tree Permit, along with a 2024 Motorized Vehicle Use Trail Permit," said Bradley Block, Recreation Program Manager, Black Hills National Forest. Block further comments, "The Forest also partners with the Black Hills Parks and Forests Association, which offers stores inside Forest offices that provide Smokey Bear products, souvenirs, and gift ideas for the upcoming holidays."

Christmas Tree Permits Now Available

Custer, SD; November 15, 2023 – This is the time of year to celebrate old and new traditions with family and friends, like venturing into your favorite national forest to harvest your own Christmas tree. Black Hills National Forest Christmas tree permits are now available for purchase either online at <u>Recreation.gov</u>, from your local Forest Service office or from private vendors throughout the Black Hills. To purchase a permit online, visit <u>Recreation.gov</u> and search for Black Hills National Forest Christmas Tree Permit. It is important to carefully read the overview and need-to-know information prior to purchasing the permit. Visitors will need to set up or login to a Recreation.gov account to complete the transaction. Each permit is \$10 for any tree, plus a \$2.50 processing fee. Users can purchase up to five permits per account. Online permits are ready to print immediately after purchasing and must be visible as you remove your tree(s) from the Forest.

"As an added convenience, the Forest Service is selling permits through Recreation.gov as an alternative to in-person transactions," said Scott Jacobson, Black Hills National Forest Public Affairs Officer. "Whether purchased online, at Forest Service offices, or through an approved vendor, we want to make sure that everyone has convenient access to purchasing Christmas Tree permits." The Forest Service's Christmas tree cutting program helps improve forest health by thinning densely populated stands of small-diameter trees. Removing these trees from the designated areas helps other trees grow larger and can improve wildlife habitat by creating open areas that provide food. Many Forest roads are subject to seasonal closures. Free Motor Vehicle Use maps are available online at

https://www.fs.usda.gov/detail/blackhills/maps-pubs/?cid=FSEPRD533421 or by downloading the

<u>Avenza App</u>.

Additionally, all 4th graders throughout the United States receive a FREE Christmas tree permit, as part of the <u>Every Kid Outdoors Program</u>. If utilizing the online system at Recreation.gov, enter the voucher or pass number when prompted. Call your local Forest Service office for more information on the Every Kid Outdoors Program.

Travel South Dakota and GMS enter a first-ever partnership to promote the state in Canada

PIERRE, S.D. – Travel South Dakota and marketing firm Global Marketing & Sales (GMS) have entered a first-ever travel/trade outreach partnership to promote South Dakota's tourist offerings to Canada.

Homeland Security to Make More Than 64,000 Additional H-2B Visas Available for FY 2024

On November 3, 2023, the U.S. Department of Homeland Security, in consultation with the U.S. Department of Labor, <u>announced</u> that it expects to make an additional 64,716 H-2B temporary nonagricultural worker visas available for Fiscal Year 2024, on top of the congressionally mandated 66,000 H-2B visas that are available each fiscal year. The supplemental visa allocation is intended to help address the need for seasonal or other temporary workers in industries such as hospitality and tourism where too few U.S. workers are available.

The H-2B program permits employers to temporarily hire noncitizens to perform nonagricultural labor or services in the United States. The employment must be of a temporary nature, such as a one-time occurrence, seasonal need, or intermittent need. Employers seeking H-2B workers must take a series of steps to test the U.S. labor market.

They must obtain certification from the U.S. Department of Labor that there are not enough U.S. workers who are able, willing, qualified, and available to perform the temporary work for which they seek a prospective foreign worker, and that employing H-2B workers will not adversely affect the wages and working conditions of similarly employed U.S. workers.
