10+ Tips for Saving Money on Your Business Expenses

While the MetLife and <u>U.S. Chamber of Commerce Small Business Index</u> reached its highest level of confidence since COVID in Q3 of 2023, there are still many businesses that are battling rising costs and trying to make every dollar count. According to the report, 33% of small businesses are saying the U.S. economy is in good health (up 9% points from Q2). Custer State Park to Host Annual Buffalo Roundup and Arts Festival

PIERRE, S.D. – The South Dakota Department of Game, Fish and Parks (GFP) will host the 58th annual Buffalo Roundup and 30th annual Arts Festival in Custer State Park this week. The Buffalo Roundup begins at 9:30 a.m. MDT on Friday, Sept. 29. The Arts Festival will run from Thursday, Sept. 28, through Saturday, Sept. 30.

"It is going to be another awesome year for the Buffalo Roundup," said Lydia Austin, Visitor Services Coordinator for Custer State Park. "In addition to the Roundup itself, the Arts Festival, and the fall season in the park make for a fantastic week as a whole."

The parking areas for the Roundup, located near the corrals along the Wildlife Loop Road, open at 6:15 a.m. MDT and close at 9:30 a.m. MDT on Sept. 29. For safety reasons, spectators need to remain in the viewing areas until all the buffalo are corralled which typically occurs around noon.

The annual Arts Festival runs from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. MDT on Thursday, 10 a.m. to 7 p.m. Friday, and from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. on Saturday. The Arts Festival takes place near the State Game Lodge and features western and bluegrass entertainment along with numerous vendors.

A state park entrance license is required on Thursday and Saturday, but there is no cost to attend the Buffalo Roundup or Arts Festival on Friday. Share the experience by using #SDintheField, #HifromSD, and #BuffaloRoundup when posting images to Facebook, Twitter or Instagram.

Next year's Buffalo Roundup will be held Friday, Sept. 27, 2024.

Black Hills National Forest

Forest Service News Release

Custer, S.D., Sept. 26, 2023 – The public will encounter contract employees working on the Black Hills National Forest in developed and dispersed recreation sites and along forest service roads. They will be out in all types of weather conditions, wearing bright orange vests and be near a sign that says "Traffic Survey Ahead."

The National Visitor Use Monitoring (NVUM) survey is being conducted on the Black Hills National Forest and will begin on October 1, 2023 and will go through September 30, 2024. The information gathered is useful for forest planning as well as local community tourism planning. It provides National Forest managers with an estimate of how many people recreate on the Forest, what activities they engage in while there, and how satisfied people were with their visit. Economic impact to the local economy is also captured in the survey.

The survey gathers basic visitor information. Surveys are voluntary, and all responses are confidential; names are not included. Interviews last about 10 minutes. Questions asked include where you recreated on the Forest, how many people traveled with you, how long you were on the Forest, what other recreation sites you visited while on

the Forest, and how satisfied you are with the facilities and services provided. About a third of the visitors will be asked to complete a confidential survey on recreation spending during their trip.

"Although the survey is entirely voluntary, participation is extremely important so we can assess visitor experiences on the Forest and strive to make it a better place to visit," said Bradley Block, Forest Recreation Program Manager. "We would appreciate it if visitors would pull over and answer a few questions. It's important for interviewers to talk with local people using the forest, as well as out-of-area visitors, so all types of visitors are represented in the study." Final Legends in Light® laser show at Crazy Horse Memorial® September 30, 2023-Custer, SD

September 30, 2023, will mark the end of an era as the Legends in Light® laser show shines for the last time against the Mountain at Crazy Horse Memorial®. What began as a dream and generous one-million-dollar donation from Joan Kroc, wife of McDonald's mogul, Ray Kroc, went on to amaze and entertain Crazy Horse Memorial visitors from all over the world for nearly 20 years. By her death in 2003, Joan Kroc was known for her philanthropic work, promoting world peace, supporting spiritually based nonprofit organizations, schools, shelters, medical research and programs to help people and nations communicate better.

"She set a dynamic example...and she included Crazy Horse in the multitude of good works she did for people in so many walks of life," Ruth Ziolkowski said of Joan Kroc in a 1985 interview.

Viga Ziolkowski, daughter of sculptor Korczak and Ruth Ziolkowski, remembers the early planning stages fondly. "Mother told Joan the idea for the laser show, which was already in the works. Joan loved the idea and presented the Memorial with a one-million-dollar donation to bring the project to life. She was a good friend and very generous donor to the Memorial over the years. It was a lot of work in those early days with many people involved. There was always something exciting going on."

After a few test runs of the Legends in Light® laser show in August 2003, it officially became part of the special daily offerings at Crazy Horse, Memorial Day 2005. The 20-minute show, made of laser images, large format

slides, and spectacular lighting is choreographed to a musical soundtrack. It was created to tell the story of the rich heritage, living cultures and contributions by Native Americans to our society, further promoting connection, understanding, and healing among all people.

Crazy Horse Memorial CEO, Whitney A Rencountre II, had these final thoughts: "We at Crazy Horse Memorial have been fortunate to have friends who assist us in many ways. The Laser Light Show was a gift which enhanced the experience of our guests for many years. As technology has advanced, the need to upgrade has become evident. Replacing current technologies would require vast resources. Regretfully, we have made the decision to retire the Laser Light Show until we are able to upgrade the necessary equipment. We thank our generous sponsors who have helped this experience continue to educate and entertain guests beyond our expectations."



Crazy Horse Memorial® First Ever 5K and 10K Fall Volksmarch
October 1, 2023 – CUSTER, SD

In coordination with the Custer State Park Buffalo Roundup and Arts Festival weekend, Crazy Horse Memorial®

will be hosting the 11th Annual Fall Volksmarch, the most popular organized hike in the United States, on Sunday, October 1, 2023. New this fall will be the option of either a 5k or 10k hike. This family event is sponsored by the Black Hills Chapter of the American Volkssport Association (AVA) and hosted by Crazy Horse Memorial. Hikers will follow dirt trails and gravel roads up to the Crazy Horse Mountain Carving. The turn-around point is on the Arm of Crazy Horse directly in front of the nine-story-high Face, which was dedicated on June 3, 1998. Hikers will get an up-close view of the Carving, where work continues on the world's largest sculpture in progress.

In continued celebration of our 75th Anniversary and memory of the late Ruth Ziolkowski, admission to the Memorial for hikers will be waived with a donation of three canned food items for the KOTA Territory Care & Share Food Drive. Hike participants pay the American Volkssport Association's fee of \$3 per person, regardless of age. Regular admission still applies to non-participants. Parking is free, with courtesy shuttle buses operating between the outlying parking lots and the start-finish area.

Advance registration is not available; gates open at 6:00am and registration begins at 7:00am at the starting point in the Memorial's upper parking area, and ends at 1:00pm. The hike itself starts at 8:00am and all hikers must be

off the trail by 4:00pm. There are no late starts. Water stations and port-a-potties will be located along the trail for your convenience. A breakfast buffet will be available in Laughing Water Restaurant from 6:00am to 10:00am. 



SCSEP is an on-the-job experience and employment program designed to help low-income individuals age 55 and older update their jobs skills, build work experience and confidence, and continue to have economic security and well-being.

Eligibility:

Individuals applying for the SCSEP must meet specific eligibility requirements in order to participate:

- A resident of South Dakota
- 55 years of age or older
- Unemployed
- · A limited household income of no more than 125 percent above of the federal poverty level

Participant Benefits:

As a participant of the SCSEP will:

- · Earn income South Dakota Minimum Wage
- Receive training and experience to help develop employment skills
- Receive free annual physical exams
- · Have the chance to obtain full- or part-time unsubsidized employment upon completion of program
- Partake in meaningful social and physical activities
- Engage in activities to support independence
